## Trip to the Zoo

## Supplies

Rotary Cutter
Cutting Mat
$8^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{\prime \prime}$ ruler or similar size
Best Press or spray starch (optional)
Scissors
Pin
Thread for piecing
Seam ripper
Iron and pressing mat
NOTE: WOF = width of fabric

## Yardage - Version 1

1- yd - focus print - A1, A2 \& A3
$1 / 2$ yd - gold - B
$1 / 3$ yd - teal - C
1/2 yd - light - D
$1 / 2$ yd - light green - E
$1 / 2$ yd - binding fabric
$1-1 / 3$ yds - backing
crib size batting

## Cutting <br> Focus print



Cut (4) 5" strips x WOF sub-cut into the following (3) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares - A1
(2) $5^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles - A2
(10) $5^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles - A3

Cut (5) 2-1/2" strips x WOF - binding

## Gold

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (12) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares - B

## Teal

Cut (1) 5" strip x WOF sub-cut into (8) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares - C

## Light print

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (16) 5" squares - D

## Light Green

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (16) 5" squares - E

## Yardage - Version 2

3/4 yd - dark floral - F
$1 / 2$ yd - medium pink floral - G
$1 / 2$ yd - light print - H
1/2 yd - light pink floral - I
$1 / 2$ yd - gold llama print - J
1/2 yd - binding
1-1/3 yd - backing
Crib size batting

## Cutting

Dark Floral - F
Cut (4) 5" strips x WOF sub-cut into (25) 5 " squares


Cut (5) 2-1/2" x WOF strips - binding

## Medium pink floral - G

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (12) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Light print - H

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (16) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Light pink floral - I

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (16) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Gold Llama print - J

Cut (2) 5" strips x WOF
sub-cut into (12) 5" squares

## Llama Friends Diagram



## Construction

1. Arrange blocks according to the diagram for the version you are making.
2. Note any direction prints if this is a concern in the overall appearance of your quilt top.
3. Join blocks into horizontal rows with a scant $1 / 4$ " seam.
4. Press seams in all odd numbered rows to the right and all even numbered rows to the left.
5. Join rows to create the patchwork top.
6. Press seams in one direction.
7. Layer quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired - note any suggested spacing requirements given for your style of batting. This will assist you in determining how closely to quilt your project. sSpacing between lines of quilting)
8. Apply binding and label your quilt.
