

Quick Fabric Corner Bookmarks



To make one fabric corner bookmark you'll need:

- cotton fabric
- fusible interfacing

Cut two 4" by 4" pieces of fusible interfacing and three 4" by 4" squares of fabric. Cut one of the interfacing squares in half diagonally and save one half for your next bookmark.





Fuse the triangle of interfacing onto the fabric you want for the corner. Fuse the square of interfacing onto the piece you want to face the front behind the corner.



Fold the fabric with the triangle in half diagonally, where the interfacing edge is, and press.





Lay the square with interfacing on it face up. Add the triangle on top in the upper right corner.




Lay the other square on top, face down. Pin.





Stitch around the outer edge with a 1/4" seam allowance, leaving 1-1 1/2" open at the bottom. Clip the corners.



Turn right side out and press, turning in the opening.






Stitch all the way around, close to the outer edge.



Slide a gift card inside or slip it onto a book.









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
