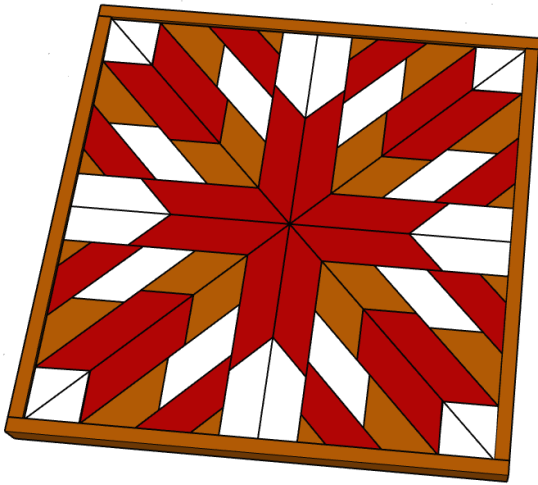




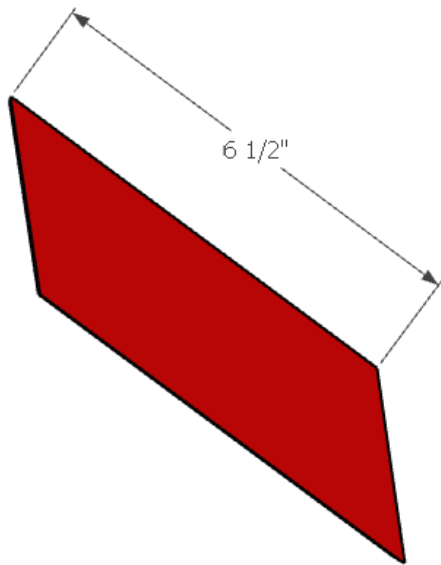
BUILD A BARNBOARD QUILT

If you want to make a barndboard quilt using the same design George did, here's the information that you need. George did his with three colors of barnboard, but you can vary the color pattern however you want.

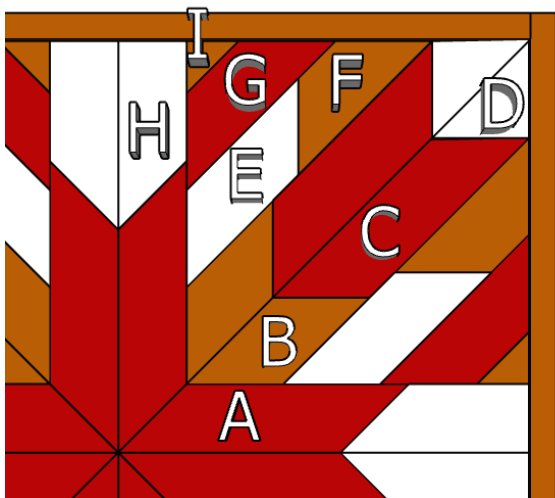




The model of George's barnboard quilt makes the colors a little more obvious. You can, of course, use any color combination you like. Be creative!



When the cut list refers to “long point to short point,” this is what that means. Be sure to watch the video and pay attention to the cut list, watching for parts that are cut to fit, instead of being cut to a specific dimension.



This identifies the parts with letters corresponding to the letters used in the cut list. Only one quadrant is shown, since all four quadrants are identical. There are mirror images of each part. Be sure you cut them correctly to create lefts and rights.

Cut list

LTS = long point to short point

CTF = cut to fit

Quantity	Part	Dimensions	Notes
1	Backer	1/2" x 1/2" x 24"	Use an exterior grade material for outdoor quilts.
8	A	3/4" x 2" x 6-1/2"	Red
8	B	3/4" x 2" x 3-1/2" LTS	Brown
8	C	3/4" x 2" x CTF	Red. Long point of miter is flush with edge of backer
8	D	3/4" x 2" x CTF	White. Make outside edge flush with edge of backer
8	E	3/4" x 2" x 4-3/4" LTS	White
8	F	3/4" x 2" x CTF	Brown. Make outside edge flush with edge of backer
8	G	3/4" x 2" x CTF	Red. Make outside edge flush with edge of backer
8	H	3/4" x 2" x CTF	White. Make outside edge flush with edge of backer
8	I	3/4" x 1-3/16" x CTF	Brown. Make outside edge flush with edge of backer
2	Short border	3/4" x 1-1/2" x 24"	Width of these pieces is 1/4" more than combined thickness of the backer and quilt pieces. On George's quilt the same brown used in the quilt was used for the frame.
2	Long border	3/4" x 1-1/2" x 25-1/2"	Width of these pieces is 1/4" more than combined thickness of the backer and quilt pieces

Project requires approximately 20 lineal feet of 2" wide red, 8' of brown and 10' of white. You can vary the colors however you like for your design.



ADHESIVE

Choose the best adhesive for your barn quilt based on where the finished project will be used (inside or outside), and what material you're using. Standard yellow glue will work great for porous material and a quilt that will be indoors. Titebond II or III are good choices for quilts that will hang outside. Polyurethane glue should be used for non-porous materials, and can also be used for outdoor quilts.

FINISH

You may not need to finish your quilt at all. Indoor quilts don't require finish, but a clear coat may enhance the colors. Do a little testing to get the look you want. Outdoor quilts made from barnboard or a similar material may not need finish if you're OK with the material continuing to weather. You can provide protection for outdoor quilts with sealers such as [boiled linseed oil](#), [Thompson's Water Seal](#) or a similar product.
